

Could you be entitled to Free School Meals, milk and a Clothing Grant?

Pupils from Primary 1-3 currently receive free school meals.

Pupils moving on to Primary 4 will have to pay for their school meals costing up to £10 per child per week (this totals up to £390 per year).

If you think you might be entitled to Free School Meals (from Primary 1-7), we ask that you complete the relevant form (forms available at school office or online at: https://www.midlothian.gov.uk/downloads/file/2830/free_school_meals_and_clothing_gra_nt_application.

The number of children in receipt of free school meals has an impact on our PEF (Pupil Equity Funding) from Scottish Government. This year 2017/2018 our PEF Fund totalled £84,000. This coming session 2018/2019 our PEF Fund will total £80,400. This money is having a significant impact on improving outcomes for learners and closing the poverty related attainment gap through targeted support and interventions.

Your child can get free school lunches up until they're 16 if you're receiving:

- <u>Universal Credit</u> (where your monthly earned income is not more than £610)
- Income Support
- income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- income-based Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Your child is also entitled to free school lunches if you receive:

- Child Tax Credit, but not Working Tax Credit, and your income is less than £16,105
- both maximum Child Tax Credit and maximum Working Tax Credit and your income is under £6,420

Families can also receive up to £100 per pupil through a Clothing Grant.
